BY BOB ANKROM—For the ninth year, the Florida Theatre Conference Festival is held at the beautiful **Lakeland Center** as well as other venues in the Lakeland area. Festival 09 features plays presented in the Secondary School, Community Theatre and the Theatre for Youth Festivals. A closing ceremony wraps up the Festival.

As opposed to running a tentative schedule in the newsletter, we provide here an overall view of the Festival. In late October, the entire program appears on our website www.flatheatre.org.

The Festival begins on Wednesday, November 11, with an **Improvisation Workshop** presented by Seminole High School.

Last year's **FTC Idol competition** proved very popular and is back this year. Sign up for this year's contest to win the \$200 or \$100 prizes!

There is a **Ten Minute Play Festival** again this year. Howev-

er, this year the plays are submitted and adjudicated **BEFORE** the Festival. Three entries and one alternate are chosen for a "presentation reading" at the Festival.

One of the highlights of our Festival is always the **Secondary School One-Act Play Festival** held in the Youkey Theatre (Lakeland Center) on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday (November 12-14). Last year, 28 schools took part in this Festival. The winner represents the State of Florida at the Southeastern Theatre Conference, held in Lexington, Kentucky, March 3-7, 2010.

This year, we add Secondary School juniors to the **College/University Scholarship Auditions**, held Thursday and Friday, November 12 and 13. Previously, only Secondary School seniors and transfers from Junior Colleges



ing in the Scholarship Auditions can sign up at the registration desk for an **Audition Workshop** to prepare them for auditions the following year.

College/University projects include the College Fair held on Thursday.

Community College students may participate in the **College/**

University auditions and the **SETC preliminary auditions** on Friday and Saturday (November 13 and 14). College/University students may participate in the **SETC Preliminary Auditions**.

Community Theatre activities include the annual **Community Theatre Festival** held in the Lake Mirror Theatre on Friday

and Saturday, (November 13 and 14). The winner of this competition moves on to the Southeastern Theatre Conference competition in Lexington.

All those attending the Festival can

participate in the more than **40 workshops** held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, (November 12, 13, and 14). Workshops in-



clude improvisation, jazz dance, tap dance, combat, monologue preparation, choosing a song for an audition, journey from stage to film, playing intentions, preparing for cattle calls, stage design, lighting design, costuming, stage management, how to effectively deal with a board of directors, and grant writing.

On Saturday, November 14, the Theatre for Youth Division holds its annual **Theatre**



for Youth Festival. There are workshops for Theatre for Youth members throughout the weekend.

The weekend concludes on Saturday evening with an **Awards Ceremony**. All winners are announced at this ceremony.

Our state festival is recognized each year by the Southeastern Theatre Conference as one of the outstanding Festivals in the Southeast.

Rules & Regulations

1. FTC Idol is open to anyone registered for the Festival. A \$5.00 registration fee is required to enter FTC Idol.
2. Talent entries may consist of any of the following: song, monologue, dance, pantomime or stand-up comedy and must come from the world of theatre or musical theatre. In selecting material, please bear in mind family audience appropriateness in regards to language and content.
3. Each contestant is allowed up to four (4) minutes performance time. This competition is designed for solo contestants only.
4. Once registered, contestants are assigned a performance slot on either Thursday or Friday evening at the Lakeland Center. The finalists perform on Saturday evening at the Florida Theatre Conference closing event.
5. Florida Theatre Conference selects the order of performance and the evening of the contestant's performance. This is based upon the number and variety of entries. For the sake of fairness, each organization is allowed up to three entrants.
6. A piano is provided, but the contestant is responsible for the accompanist. A CD player is provided. Only instrumental CDs, please. No lead vocals.
7. Audience members may vote for contestants on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Each vote costs \$1.00. Popular votes are combined with the judges' scores to determine the contestants' standing.
8. Decisions by the judging panel are final.
9. Contestants are notified if they are not selected for the competition, solely based on space limitation. First come, first served. If more than three entrants from one organization are received, we accept the first three we open. If not selected, the registration fee is returned to you.

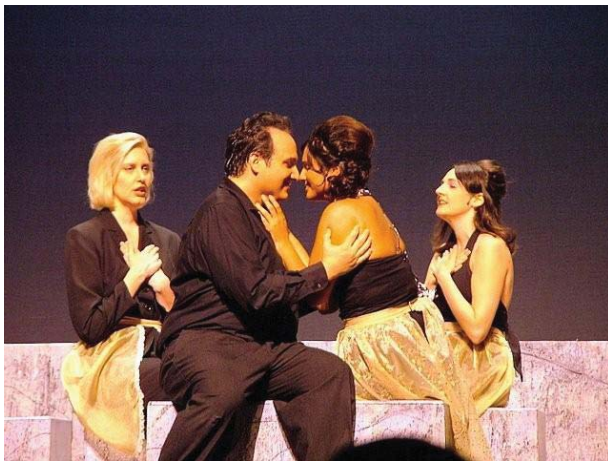

BY RICK KERBY—Tallahassee's **Theatre A La Carte** represented not only the state of Florida but the entire Southeast this past June at the American Association of Community Theater Festival. This national event was hosted by Washington State Community Theatre Association in Tacoma, Washington June 23–28.

Theatre A La Carte traveled with a company of 40 actors, musicians and technicians to perform their condensed version of the musical *Nine*. They participated with 11 other companies from across the country. There was even a group from Belgium representing our overseas military. Mary Britt, who is a member of the FTC board and Executive Director of Ocala Civic Theatre, served on the adjudication team. Other Floridian companies attending were Bay

Street Players at the State Theatre, Manatee Players, and Venice Theatre.

At the end of the week, the awards gala complete with choreographed singing presenters, earned **Theatre A La Carte's Lauren Antista** an award as Outstanding Performance by an Actress in a Featured Role.

When asked about the experience, President of Theatre A La Carte Eric Hurst said "to be immersed in nothing but community theatre for an entire week, to sense the feeling of real community was amazing. It was a wonderful experience."
